Year 11 – Final Arrangements

Congratulations to our intrepid Year 11 students who have done so well with GCSE Examinations this week alongside their peers in Year 13 who have made an equally positive start to their first A-Level Examinations.

Next week, we will host a Final Assembly for Year 11 students on Thursday following their final core examination of the half-term (GCSE Science). After the morning examination, students will have break time and an opportunity to sign shirts, we will organise a year group photograph outside Sixteen07 before leading to the Main Hall for the Final Assembly which will involve End of Year Awards and a celebration of achievements. Following this assembly, students will have an earlier finish with a small number of candidates remaining on site to complete their GCSE Computer Science examinations in the afternoon.

Year 11 students will begin study leave from this afternoon unless otherwise notified in writing by the Senior Leadership Team before Thursday. We expect students to continue to revise and prepare for their examinations and their class teachers will continue to be available according to their timetabled lessons, if they choose to come in. Students will be required to attend all examinations in full school uniform and sign in at Student Services.

Mental Health Awareness Week

We continue to invest in the mental health education of our students, recognising the complex nature of adolescence and the challenges that they face. All year groups participate in regular PSHE sessions and have completed an emotional wellbeing module including strategies for good mental health. We have also spent curriculum time considering the impact of relationships and how they can affect mental health and how to support someone with difficulties including signposting to the safeguarding team where concerns have arisen.

The unsaid truth of the increase in mental health concerns is the unregulated, harmful, and relentless social media that children have been exposed to over the last ten years. This has led to children viewing more inappropriate content and becoming dependent on smart devices. We continue to use assemblies to advise our students of these risks and provide a 'mobile free' campus for this reason, amongst many others.

This is my opportunity to share an <u>article</u> which deserves a wider audience, and whilst this relates to girls specifically, it is a problem that all parents will recognise. I believe that this is a conversation that our society needs to have if we are to move beyond a focus week and into a reality of better mental health for children.
