

Dear Parent/Carer,

Industrial Action: Wednesday 5th and Friday 7th July

As you will know, the National Education Union (NEU) have <u>announced</u> two further days of industrial action on Wednesday 5th and Friday 7th July. We are deeply concerned to learn of this disruption and it continues to look likely that protracted industrial action could further disrupt school in the Autumn Term as there appears to be little evidence of reconciliation between the government and education unions.

We have reviewed the likely impact of industrial action and as a result we will expect <u>Year 10 and 12 students</u> <u>to attend school</u> on these days. We have selected these groups based on the school timetable and as they are approaching their final assessment stage of school. We will also make provision for children with an EHCP and students identified by the inclusion team. If this applies to your child, we will contact your separately. We will set work for all other Year 7, 8 and 9 students on Satchel One.
