Back to school: Uniform

As a timely reminder before the break, please note that all students will be expected to return in full school uniform and without piercings/infractions that are not acceptable. We would be grateful if parents could remain mindful that **we do not permit the following**, as per the uniform **policy**:

- Nail polish or false nails
- Unnatural hair dye
- Multiple ear piercings (one single stud in each ear maximum)
- Nose piercings

We will specifically follow up on these features of our uniform policy to ensure high standards from all:

- Blazers to be worn in school.
- Grey pleated skirt, regulation length, on or just above the knee.

This is in response to a small minority of students attending school without a regulation blazer or wearing skirts at an inappropriate length (i.e., not regulation length).
