These were not unique issues related to our community but rather concerns that impacted all local schools.

As a result, I would strongly urge our students to behave in a way that is commensurate with our school values. I must express, in terms unmistakable, that we do not condone or endorse any poor behaviour in our community whether that be discriminatory language on the terraces, a lack of respect toward club officials or interactions that could place anyone at the risk of physical harm. Put simply, we want our students to be ambassadors for doing what is right, whatever the context and wherever they are.

I hope that this note will promote open and honest conversations with our students. Our town and the surrounding villages have so much to be proud about and I sincerely hope that this weekend is another example of the things that we do best; community, positive relationships and enjoyment.
