#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE: Asthma**

Following my letter on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> April which reminded parents that students must not bring aerosols and deodorant sprays into school, I want to reiterate the rationale for this expectation.

We know that aerosol sprays and perfumes are known to cause asthma attacks in some people with asthma. **This has happened in our school in the last week.** This was not the result of anything malicious or deliberate but the impact for the person involved, at it's most severe, could have been fatal.

We understand and respect that personal hygiene is important to everyone and that our students will want to use deodorant before school and after PE particularly as things get hotter, but we ask that students use alternatives such as roll on which do not present any risk to people with asthma. Please note that students who use aerosols or perfume before they arrive in school may also inadvertently lead to an asthma attack.

This week, we have spoken to students in assemblies about the importance of this issue and we will be issuing further reminders next week to ensure that everyone has a clear picture of why this issue matters and the potential consequences to those who suffer from asthma.

From next week, we will remind students again and we will proactively confiscate aerosols or perfumes from students who bring these items into school to reinforce our expectations and to make these boundaries clear.

Thank you for taking this seriously and for speaking to your child. We have a duty of care to everyone in our school, both staff and students, and this is something we need to work together to achieve.
