First week back arrangements

This week, the following year groups will return to school according to this schedule:

- Wednesday 31st August: Year 7, Year 11, Year 12 (induction day) and Year 13 only
- Thursday 1st September: All students in all year groups except for Year 12
- Monday 5th September: Year 12 begin A-Level timetable

Students should arrive in school so that they are at their Form Tutor room by 8.45am for the start of PSHE. Note that the gates will be locked at **8.45am** and students who arrive after this time will be admitted with a 'Late' mark. If students accrue more than one mark per half-term, they will be placed in detention after school.

The school day ends at **3.15pm**. We ask parents and students to take care on Burnmill Road at peak times.



Reminder: What will the format of the day look like this year?

On Friday 6th May, we communicated the new structure to the school day based on revised expectations from the DfE regarding a minimum length of time during the school week.

We made the changes outlined in the table below:

- An increase in the length of Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) lessons in Form Tutor groups by 5 minutes, every morning
- An increase in the length of the morning break by 5 minutes, every morning
- An increase in the length of the lunchtime by 5 minutes, every afternoon
- A reduction in the length of lessons **from two-hours to 100-minutes** to reflect feedback from students who have told us that they struggle to sustain concentration during two-hour lessons. This will also mean that all lessons have a consistent length. **Please note there is <u>no reduction</u> to curriculum time**

School Improvement Priorities (2022)

In August, the Senior Leadership Team and the Local Governing Body evaluated the key strengths and areas of development for the school. Our evaluation included assessment information but was certainly not limited to GCSE and A-Level examination results. Rather, we considered evidence from a wide range of sources including quality assurance evidence, student feedback, parent surveys, and statistical information (i.e., attendance). Ultimately, we have chosen to prioritise six-key areas to improve the experiences of all students.

We feel very proud to serve a strong and successful school that is providing high-quality education, experiences, and outcomes. We are unashamedly aspiring to become an 'Outstanding' school, not because we want to impress Ofsted but because we want students to get the very best education. We know that they only get one chance at school, and we are all determined to make that count.

Parents have a vital role to play in the education of their child and therefore, we hoped that by sharing an overview of the school improvement priorities for the forthcoming academic year you can feel informed about our school improvement journey.

We hope that this will also explain why we will be placing such a strong focus on good attendance this year. The evidence clearly shows the link between good attendance (95% and above) and attainment and we are grateful for your support in ensuring that your child attends regularly and makes the most of their opportunities.
