Safer Internet Day was celebrated globally last Tuesday 7th February 2023 with a theme of "**Together for a better internet**", it calls upon everyone to join to make the internet a safer and better place, especially for children and young people. Coordinated in the UK by the UK Safer Internet Centre (www.saferinternet.org.uk) the aim is to help promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology.

In recent years, there has been a dramatic growth in internet communication via social networking sites such as Facebook, Twitter and Snapchat and a major factor in this rise is the increased accessibility to the internet using 'smart' phones.
