- Staff will not keep secrets, they will explain • they have a responsibility to share safeguarding worries.
- Staff may make notes or check details with • you.
- The safeguarding team may come and see • you, they will explain what will happen next.
- The safeguarding team may refer the concern • to other professionals (police, Children's Services, health, etc.)
